
A 7-week Lenten Devotional Guide

Light and Life in Christ

John's Gospel is treasured by followers of Jesus for its simple and intimate portrayal of His life, death, and Resurrection, and also for the deep layers of meaning that still speak to our hearts today. In the weeks



leading to Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday, we will **Journey to the Cross** (and the empty Tomb!) together, along with Jesus' disciples, seeking to know our Lord more intimately, and to be inspired individually and as a community of faith. May the Lord illuminate us with His Light, and renew us with His Life!

This devotional guide has three sections:

- **1. That You May Believe**: An disciple's walk through John's Gospel to inspire a deeper understanding of Jesus as Son of God, Messiah, and giver of the Holy Spirit
- **2. Journey to the Cross**: Daily Readings and prayers for individual reflection through Lent to Easter Sunday (March 9 April 20)
- **3. United in Prayer**: Guided EagleNaz Community Prayers for LIFE Group gatherings and individual devotions beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 6 through Holy Week based on the sermon series on "How to Pray"

That You May Believe

John concludes his Gospel in **20:29-31** by revealing his purpose for writing: Jesus said, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; **blessed are those who have not**



seen and yet have believed." Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." In this season that leads to Holy Week, let us reflect on and deepen our belief in Jesus, and receive life in His name - eternal life to come, and the abundant life He promised in this world!



Journey to The Cross

The season of Lent, Good Friday and Resurrection is about Christ creating an entirely new order of things. Even the season of Spring is a time of welcoming new life and new beginnings. As a congregation, God is leading EagleNaz into a new things as well! Let the words of John's Gospel form us in this time of reflection and celebration of Jesus!

As we engage with the Word in groups and individuals, we will also put into practice the teachings on prayer from our sermon series.



That You May Believe

John's narrative is a unique and intimate portrait written by "the disciple whom Jesus loved." At the time of its writing, John was ministering in the multicultural city of Ephesus, proclaiming Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah to curious



Jews, and the powerful Son of God to Gentiles who were familiar with the many Hellenistic deities worshipped at local temples. John wants his readers to know that Jesus is more powerful than these false gods!

Some of the most well-known were:

- **Zeus, Poseidon, Hades** 'The Big 3' Greek gods. Zeus controlled everything on the surface of the earth up to the heavens, Poseidon controlled the sea (including affecting storms), and Hades controlled the underworld and the realm of death.
- **Asclepius** Son of Apollo, Greek god of healing. Adherents would travel to his temples to pray for physical healing, leaving behind a clay figure of the body part they hoped would be healed. Remains of his temples have been found in many areas, including in Jerusalem!
- Dionysius Popular god of wine, revelry and fertility
- Pan god of shepherds, flocks
- Ceres/Demeter goddess of grain, agriculture, fertile fields

John's readers raised in the Jewish tradition were very familiar with the Old Testament stories, including the incredible passage where God introduces Himself by name to Moses in **Exodus 3:13-14**: Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?" God said to Moses, "I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I am has sent me to you." John wants these readers to know that Jesus is the "I am" made flesh to dwell among us!

Week 4 (March 30 - April 5) Prayer: Lord, You bring new life, even as You raised Lazarus from the dead. Guide our congregation as we bring Your new life to people around us!
Week 5 (April 6-12) Prayer: Lord, fill us as believers and as a congregation with the promise Holy Spirit as we serve You together!
Week 6 (April 13-19) Prayer: Lord, we believe You will draw people and families to Yourself this week as we prepare to remember Your death and celebrate Your Resurrection. Inspire us by Your Spirit as we lift up the name of our crucified and risen Lord!
